
You do NOT include your source code.

People often forget to put the final period.


Don't forget to remove http:// from URLs

How to Reverse Indent


Type in your MLA and let it text wrap as normal. Then highlight the MLA and choose FORMAT.



In the drop-down menu, choose ALIGN & INDENT then choose INDENTATION OPTIONS.



Now change SPECIAL INDENT from NONE to HANGING.
